Hello friends, Running Blind members and supporters! 2021 was another difficult year with Covid again playing a major role in everyone's lives. Despite the difficulties, the OUB Adventure Camp partnership continued, and we worked together with them for a beautiful boating adventure day on Lake Charlevoix. I added a special opportunity and brought for two visually impaired friends along who volunteered to help with the boating day. (My sister also joined in.) The three of them all joined in and helped out with the boating day, which was fun for them good help for OUB and their campers.

## 2021 OUB / RB Boating Adventure Day a big success!

OUB returned to in person camps this year, so we partnered with them for a wonderful boating adventure day on Lake Charlevoix. The group was a bit smaller than some, but it worked out well as the size allowed everyone to fit on the big 14-person boat I rented for the event. In most years, we'd have to divide the group in two and split time on the boat vs time on shore, but this year everyone who wanted to go all fit on the boat together, so they all got plenty of time in the water being dragged behind the boat, which is the treasured activity that the campers and staffers all love to do. I also sprang for a Subway lunch for everyone which made things a lot easier for the OUB staff, who were short-staffed and were a bit ragged at this point, as this was the last day of a longer U.P. trip they made. All in all, it was a wonderful event and a great weekend.
